Description of the Project:

The course was delivered by a mixture of training and teaching methods and hands on field measurement, comprising a first day of classroom sessions to introduce the different aspects of drilling supervision followed by three days of practical field work and a final day in the classroom for rounding up and reflection on lessons learnt. Participants were encouraged to ask questions for clarification regularly throughout the course.

- Understand the importance of effective supervision in borehole construction for sustainability
- Understand the steps and detailed actions required in full time supervision
- Understand the steps and detailed actions required in part time supervision

Be able to quality assure and certify drilling records

- Be in a position to undertake borehole construction supervision
